4. What challenges are before you that require taking some risks for God?

5. When it comes to taking a risk, the outcome is usually determined by someone's priorities. If the outcome is considered "worth it," they're willing to risk about anything. What is it worth to you to follow Christ?

6. What are you willing to give up in order to have a relationship with Christ?

7. What wouldn't you give up in order to have a relationship with Christ?

1. Honestly, if given the choice, would you have left that army before the battle ever got going? Why or why not?

2. Why do you think Gideon was okay with what God was asking him to do? Would you have been if you were Gideon? Why or why not?

3. God called Gideon to lead his people. Did Gideon accept that challenge?

4. What are some ways Gideon challenged the people to follow him in Judges 7:17?

5. How might that be similar to how we can lead people today?

6. If people "did what you did," would they be living for God or against Him? What does that say about how you're living?

Ephesians 6:12

1. What does this verse say we are battling against?

2. In what ways would you agree that life is a battle?

3. Who do you feel yourself battling with?

4. Do you think you are winning or losing this battle?

5. Are you leading anyone else into battle with you? Do you expect to win?

Homework

- Memorize Judges 7:17
- Don't live in fear of the battle. Roman 8:31 states "If God is for us, who can be against us?"
- Are there ways in which you can more actively engage in moving the Kingdom of God forward?

2. How do you think seeing Jesus risen from the dead changed their lives from that point forward?

1 Corinthians 15:1-4

1. Paul says in verse 2 that it is by this gospel that we are what?

2. Paul says this gospel is of what importance in verse 3?

3. What is the gospel summarized?

4. How important do you think people consider this gospel today? Why do you think we view it that way?

MAKING IT REAL

1. If you believe that Jesus rose from the dead, how should that change your life?

2. Has it changed your life yet? Why not?

3. What do you think it means that life is not a game, but an opportunity. What does that mean to you?

4. How many people do you think go through life absent of the knowledge that Jesus is alive? Does that explain the way some people live?

Romans 10:14-15

1. What do those verses say about telling people the good news about Jesus?

2. People won't hear unless we tell them. God is calling us to open our mouth. Who is someone you need to share the good news of Jesus with?

Homework

- Memorize Matthew 28:10
- How many people do you know that need to hear the good news of Christ's resurrection? Make a list.
- Make opportunities to meet with the people you listed and lovingly share the Gospel with them.
- Remain connected to the people you have witnessed to, inviting them to church and your small group.

1. What do each of these passages say about obedience?

2. How are obedience and love related in the life of a Christ follower?

3. How well do you think you obey God?

MAKING IT REAL

1. Have you ever felt "lost" in life? When? What had happened that made you feel that way?

2. What do you think some of God's most important directions for life are?

3. Which of God's laws do you think are pretty easy to follow? Which are hard?

4. What is one way you really struggle in obeying God?

5. What do you think influenced the apostles to feel so strongly about obeying God?

6. If you were in their situation, would you have been tempted to obey the people questioning you instead? Why?

7. There are lots of people and situations that will call for your obedience, and be sure about one thing - you're always obeying SOMEONE. Why is it better to obey God rather than anyone else?

8. How can obeying other influences (friends at school, stuff online, rumors and gossip) bring you down?

9. How can obeying other voices in your life lead you to being lost?

Homework

- Memorize Acts 5:29
- As you go through your daily routine take note of who you are obeying more, God or other influences.
- Make a concentrated effort to obey God over everything else even if it is uncomfortable.
- Read the Bible daily for direction.

Acts 9:1-19

1. What was Paul known for when he was named Saul? What was he on his way to Damascus to do?

2. What do you think of Paul's conversion? How intense must it have been for him personally?

3. What do you think that the average Christian would have thought in learning that the dangerous Saul had converted to the faith?

4. Acts 9:16 talks about how Paul had to suffer for God's name. What do you think is the connection between serving and suffering?

2 Corinthians 11:22-28

1. Which of Paul's sufferings do you find the most tragic?

2. How does Paul recount these sufferings? With regret? With boasts?

3. What do you think it must have been like to be Paul?

4. How do you think Paul looked back on his conversion after his suffering?

5. Do you think Paul viewed it all as "worth it?"

MAKING IT REAL

1. Judging your life today, do you think you are serving God or wasting your time?

2. Why do you think doing anything other than living for God a waste of time?

3. We all know Paul came to serve God. First, he had to give his life to God and surrender to him. Do you think you've done that?

4. After we surrender to God, there's a lot of work to do. What do you think you are particularly good at that could help people come to know Jesus?

5. To serve God, you're going to have to give things up: your own plans, your own dreams, etc. Are you willing to do that? Do you understand what that means?

6. Which would be better, to suffer for God's name or to waste your life? Why do you think that?

7. What are some ways you can serve God immediately, from this day forward?
